Message from the Pastor

"Beware, keep alert, for you do not know when the time will come". (Mark.13: 33) This weekend, we begin the season of Advent. Advent is the season when we all are invited to a journey away from all that would distract us from the advent of our Messiah...Jesus Christ, to that place of peace and solitude wherein we can rediscover God's presence without obstruction and hear God's voice without distraction. Through fasting and prayer and by attending carefully to the special scriptural gifts of this season, we will become renewed and fit to welcome Jesus Christ. Advent is also a season when we are called to "devout and joyful expectation" of the first coming of Christ at Christmas and of the second coming at the end of time. Both of these elements are echoed throughout the whole season. The two themes run in a complex harmony. In this first week, it is the Second Coming that provides the dominant thrust. The central theme is Jesus' warning to us to be alert, watchful and prepared because Christ's Second Coming, coinciding with the end of the world, can occur at any time. People, in general, have an unreasonable fear about the end of the world. In the past several years had been foretold as the end of the world to happen. Many books have been written and movies have been produced foretelling the end of the world. Excessive fear of the tribulations accompanying the end of the world led the followers of religious cults like led by Jim Jones (in 1978), and followers of Heaven's Gate (in 1997), to commit mass suicide. But Jesus gives us the assurance that we need not be afraid of the end of the world, Christ's Second Coming, and the Last Judgment, if we remain alert and prepared. The Church invites us on this first Sunday of Advent to prepare for Christ's Second Coming; by properly celebrating during this Christmas season the fond memory of Christ's first coming 2000 years ago; by experiencing Christ's daily advent or coming in every Eucharistic celebration, in the Holy Bible, and in the worshipping community; and by preparing daily for Jesus' Second Coming which, for us, will happen at the unknown moment of our death or the equally unknown moment when the world will end. So let us live in the living presence of Jesus every day waiting for his Second Coming. Like the early Christians who experienced the living presence and coming of Jesus with absolute certainty, let us wait for Jesus' Second Coming with absolute certainty praying "Maranatha" which means "Come, O Lord". May God bless us and keep us ever prepared for Christ's Second Coming.
