## **Message from the Pastor**

"If any wish to come after me, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me". (Mathew.16:24) In the Apocryphal book 'Acts of Peter' there is an account of the encounter between Risen Jesus and St. Peter along the Appian Way. At the time of the great persecution under Nero, the Christians of Rome told Peter to leave. "You're too valuable," they said. "Get out of town! Find your safety! Go to another place and preach the Gospel." Peter hastily hurried out of town as fast as he could. But as he hurried along the Appian Way, away from the City of Rome, he was met by Christ, going toward the city. Peter said to him in Latin, "Quo Vadis, Domine?" "Where are you going, Lord?" To which Jesus replied, "Back to Rome, to be crucified with my people. Where are you going, Peter?" Peter's eyes filled with tears of remorse, as he turned and walked back to Rome, where, according to tradition, he was crucified head downward, feeling that he was not worthy to die in the same manner as had his Lord. Jesus' question to Peter comes to us also today: "Quo Vadis?" "Where are you going?" Are we going with Christ, or away from Him and from His cross? That is the really important question. It doesn't matter, how far we have traveled. What does matter is the direction in which we are going. Jesus has put forward three requirements for a person to be his true disciple: deny oneself; take up one's cross and follow Jesus. No Christian life without Cross. Christian discipleship is a life with the Crucified Christ.

The Summer is over, and we begin a new school year and also a new year in our parish life. While looking back, we had a blessed year, with abundant blessings from God on individuals, families, and the community. Let us thank the Lord through the intercession of St. Peter, our Patron. Let us remember with thanks all those who offered their time, energy, and wealth for the growth of our parish. When looking forward, we have great expectations: we have to grow more in holiness as an individual and as a community; grow more in our sense as one community; we have to make our parish more active and vibrant; our young people, both children and youth can have more participation in the parish life; we have to have more people as volunteers in the different ministries of the parish. Our Christian Faith was handed down to us through different generations, through our ancestors and today it is our mission to make sure that this process continues without fail through the generations coming after us. St. Mother Theresa of Calcutta has said, "Do you want to do something beautiful for God? There is a person who needs you. This is your chance". Let us make our lives 'something beautiful for God' by giving ourselves to the service of others, to the service of the Church and to the service of our community.
