Message from the Pastor

"This is my beloved son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him" (Mathew 17:5). There is a mysterious story in the 2nd Book of Kings. Israel was at war with Aram, and Elisha, the prophet used his prophetic powers to reveal the strategic plans of the Aramean army to the Israelites. At first the King of Aram thought that one of his officers was acting as a spy, but when he learned the truth, he dispatched troops to go and capture Elisha who was residing in Dothan. The Aramean troops moved in under cover of darkness and surrounded the city. In the morning, when Elisha's servant found that that they were surrounded, he asked Elisha, "Oh, my lord, what shall we do?" The prophet answered "Don't be afraid. Those who are with us are more than those who are with them." Then Elisha prayed to God, "O Lord, open his eyes so he may see." Then the Lord opened the servant's eyes, and he looked and saw the hills full of horses and chariots of fire all around Elisha (2 Kings 6:8-23). This vision was all that Elisha's disciple needed to reassure him. Transfiguration of Jesus is such an assurance given to His disciple to convince them of His Divine Sonship.

The Feast of the Transfiguration of Jesus is celebrated in the Church on 6th of August. The feast was present in various forms in the early church, and it was made a universal feast by Pope Callixtus III in the year 1456. All three Synoptic Gospels (Mathew, Mark & Luke) narrate the event of the Transfiguration and it is placed shortly after Peter's confession of Faith that Jesus is the Messiah and Jesus' first prediction of his passion, crucifixion, death, and the Resurrection. In Transfiguration Jesus is revealed as a glorious figure, superior to Moses and Elijah. The first purpose of Jesus' Transfiguration was to consult His Heavenly Father in order to ascertain His plan for Jesus' suffering, death, and Resurrection. The second purpose was to make Jesus' chosen disciples aware of His Divine glory, so that they might discard their worldly ambitions about a political Messiah. The third purpose was to strengthen their Faith and hope and to encourage them to persevere in the way of life to which they had been called. On the mountain, Jesus is identified by the Heavenly Voice as the Son of God. Thus, the Transfiguration event is the manifestation or revelation of Who Jesus really is. Jesus' Transfiguration gives us a glimpse of the Heavenly glory awaiting those who do God's Will by placing their trusting Faith in Him. Jesus' Transfiguration offers us a message of hope and encouragement. In moments of doubt, during feelings of despair, when going through sufferings and tribulations, the expectation of our transformation in Heaven helps us to reach out to God and listen to His consoling words: "This is my beloved son/daughter in whom I am well pleased." Let us look forward to it.
