Message from the Pastor

July 14

"Come to Me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). During the days of the Second Vatican Council, Pope St. John XXIII used to submit all his anxieties to God with this prayer every night: "Lord, Jesus, I'm going to bed. It's your Church. Take care of it!" Dwight D. Eisenhower, the 34th President of America was aware of the inner rest derived from submitting one's daily life to God. He had that rest even though he was the supreme commander of the Allied forces in the Western Europe during the Second World War. His every decision during that awful conflict had monumental consequences. How did he deal with the pressure? He didn't try to carry his burden alone. He entrusted everything to God. At nights Eisenhower would simply pray, "Lord, with your grace I've done the best I can. You take over until morning."

Today we live in a world that is too busy...too stressed...to much complicated. A good number of people today suffers from mild to moderate depression, anxiety, loneliness, and other painful symptoms which are attributed mainly to stress. People of all walks of life see a need for less stress in their daily lives. Approximately half of all diseases may be linked to stress-related origins, including ulcers, colitis, bronchial asthma, high blood pressure and some forms of cancer. Unmanaged stress is a leading factor in homicides, suicides, childabuse, spouse-abuse, and other aggravated assaults. The stress related problems take a tremendous toll on the economy also. So, everybody today seeks rest and peace in their lives. We cannot find the real peace and comfort anywhere except in Jesus Christ who said, "Come to Me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28) It is an invitation from Jesus to all those who are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, to go to him, and the promise from him that he will give comfort to them. Today we are burdened by many things: business, concerns about jobs, relationships, marriage, money, health, children, security, old age and a thousand other things. It is only by in Jesus that we can find peace, rest, and refreshment for our lives. So, Jesus asks us to cast away our burdens and take on his yoke. This is because, unlike the burdens we bear, His yoke is easy and His burden light. It is light because it is carried in love and love makes even the heaviest burden light. Our burden becomes light and easy when we remember that our burden is to love God, both directly, and by loving others, seeing God living in them. Let us unload our burdens of the day-to-day life before the Lord on the Altar and experience the peace, rest and refreshment Jesus has promised.
