## **Message from the Pastor**

"Yes, for the love of Jesus I forgive him... and I want him to be with me in Paradise." These were the words of St. Maria Goretti on her deathbed. It was this forgiveness that Maria offered to Alessandro, who murdered her, when she appeared to him in his 11th year of a 30-year prison sentence. While asleep, Alessandro saw a young girl dressed in white, gathering lilies in a garden. She approached him, smiling, and offered him the lilies one by one. As he accepted them, each lily turned into a still, white flame. A repentant man when he awoke, Alessandro sought to make amends and to seek forgiveness and reconciliation. In an open letter he wrote years later, he credits Maria, saying, "Little Maria was really my light, my protectress; with her help, I behaved well during the 27 years of prison and tried to live honestly when I was again accepted among the members of society." Upon his release from prison after 28 years, he went straight to Maria's mother Assunta on a Christmas Eve to beg her forgiveness. She forgave him, saying, "If my daughter can forgive him, who am I to withhold forgiveness?" Not only did she forgive Alessandro, but she called him her son. She requested that they attend Midnight Mass together. There, they humbly received the Eucharist, kneeling side by side. Twenty-one years later, Assunta and Alessandro knelt again, this time in Rome, among a quarter of a million people with tears in their eyes as Maria was canonized a Saint.

Today we live in an atmosphere of hatred, rage, brutality, retaliation etc. Emotion runs high that it takes over reason leading to violence. People become indifferent to the qualities like forgiveness and mercy. It is in this context that the words of Jesus about the need of forgiveness become relevant. To be forgiven of our sins we have to forgive those who have hurt us. At all times and in all places, we are to embody God's forgiving Grace. Forgiveness involves more than absolution of guilt. It involves reconciliation-the mending of our past, nowfractured, relationships and the healing of our mutual brokenness. It involves intentional work to heal and be reconciled with another. God awakens in us the wholeness that invites us to share in His holiness. Healing, reconciliation, and forgiveness, acting together, sketch a way of life embodying an ever-deepening friendship with God and with one another. Let us forgive, forget, and be reconciled. In the light of eternity and the shortness of our span of life, harboring old grudges is pointless. Neighbors who remained hostile and unforgiving till their death are buried a short distance from one another in the same cemetery. Our ability and willingness to forgive are the measure of the depth of our Christianity. The forgiveness that we offer others is the indispensable condition which makes it possible for us to receive God's forgiveness and to pray meaningfully: "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."
