#### Message from the Pastor

"O woman, great is your faith! Be it done for you as you desire." (Mathew 15: 28). Eugene Peterson once said that for Christians, the Bible should never be the footnote to the news of the day; but rather the day's news should always be just the footnote to the Bible. "If we forget that the newspapers are footnotes to Scripture and not the other way around," he said, "we will finally be afraid to get out of bed in the morning." Today's headline is never to be found in your news source. That is always just the footnote. Scripture is the headline. So, what should be today's headline? It can be put this way: An unnamed Canaanite woman is described by Jesus as having great faith.

This weekend an unnamed woman who is a Canaanite (not a Jew) is at the centre of our reflection. It is the simple story about a woman who did not care about all the discussions and claims around her world regarding who are worthy or not worthy of salvation. She cares only about her daughter. And her story reminds us of what faith and prayer and love looks like when we are faced with real, personal adversity. It is a story that brings us back to the basics, of what it means to trust in Jesus. This woman is praised by Jesus as a person of great faith in contrast to Peter in the last weekend's gospel passage where he was pictured as a person having little faith. When Peter was caught in the storm, he took his eyes off of Jesus and began to sink. When this woman is caught in a very different storm, she stayed focused on Jesus, and fell to her knees before him. That's the kind of faith that is expected of one who follows Jesus. The Canaanite woman puts before us a challenge...a challenge to a life of faith...a challenge to place all our trust in Jesus even in the moments of humiliation, distress, rejection, loss or even death...a challenge to persist in our faith even when we are depressed and frustrated. If we take up this challenge and live our faith we will hear the words of Jesus, praising us "Oh how great is your faith".
