Message from the Pastor

When King Henry VIII of England declared himself as the head of the Church in England breaking away from the Catholic Church, St. Thomas More who was councillor to the King and Lord High Chancellor of England could not approve it. While his friends and officials signed a document approving the King's action and declared loyalty to him, Thomas More refused to do it. Even though King Henry demanded that he sign or face arrest, trial for treason, and execution by the state, More refused: he knew he had two obligations, one to God and one to his country. When they conflicted, More knew he had no choice but to remain faithful to his obligation to God. On his way to public execution in 1535, More encouraged the people to remain steadfast in the Faith. His last recorded words were: "I die the King's good servant, but God's first." His final words state his love and loyalty to Henry, but his loyalty to Catholic Church came first. In other words, his first allegiance was to God, not to the king. He was convinced that the king's break with the Catholic Church was a form of heresy. Following his conscience, he stood by his convictions even in the face of imminent martyrdom. We Christians have dual citizenship: We are citizens of our country and citizens of Heaven. We have an allegiance and an obligation to each. We hope the obligations will never clash. But if they ever do, we must resolve them as Thomas More did, without compromise to our God or to our conscience. Jesus, by stating, "Give therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and to God the things that are God's." reminds us that we should fulfill our obligations to the state; but we should be much more concerned and careful about our service to God and our obligations to Him as our Creator and Lord.

World Mission Sunday: The World Mission Sunday is observed on **October 22**, **2023**. Let us join the missionary work of the Church by encouraging missionary spirit in us and in others, by promoting missionary vocations and by collaborating spiritually and materially with the missionary needs of the Church.

Message from Diocesan Liturgy Commission

The Triduum liturgy is the culmination of the entire year, and it makes sense that the community's Sunday experience influences their anticipation of Triduum. If our assemblies are not engaged by music, preaching, hospitality, or other sacramental encounters at the Sunday liturgy, they are not likely to seek out more of the same.

It is common to think of our Sunday liturgies as "Little Easters," particularly because we celebrate the Risen Christ in every liturgy. Perhaps we also could consider Easter Sunday, and thus Triduum, as "One Great Big Sunday" that is integrally connected to all other Sundays of the year. This larger framework can inform how we plan, prepare, celebrate the Triduum, and balance the dialogue between Easter Sunday and all of the Sundays of the liturgical year.

With this in mind parishes and individuals are invited to join a Livestream talk Three Days but One Feast-Celebrating the Triduum in the Parish offered by Fr. Bill Burke, Pastor of St. Marguerite Bourgeoys Parish, Sydney. This talk will take place on Tuesday, November 7, 2023, 7:00pm, at St. Joseph Church, Port Hawkesbury, NS. This presentation will be available to watch live on our Diocesan Website (<u>www.antigonishdiocese.com</u>). Pastors, parish pastoral councils, liturgy committee members and all interested parishioners are invited to login for this event.
