Message from the Pastor

"You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." (Mathew 16:16) Charles Lamb and Mary Lamb are British writers, who jointly authored in 1807 the English children's book Tales from Shakespeare intended "for the use of young persons". Charles Lamb has also published several critical papers on Shakespear. One night, when Lamb was sitting with his guests, someone asked Lamb, "Suppose, Shakespeare were to stroll into our dining room at this moment." He replied, "We would raise a glass of port to the great man." Another one said, "Suppose, Jesus were to come here." Lamb answered, "We would all get down on our knees." There is the essential difference between the Man from Nazareth and all other great people you can think of. "The Christ is God, and all others, no matter what their deeds, are who walk on the stage for a brief time and then exit." (Fr. Gilhooly) Through the Declaration of Peter in Caesarea Philippi, Jesus is asserted as the Christ the Son of the Living God, the Lord, and the Saviour.

In Caesarea Philippi the disciples were faced with two questions. The first one was "Who do the people say that the Son of Man is?" As this question was about the public opinion about Jesus, it was easy to answer. The disciples gave different answers like John the Baptist, Elijah, Jeremiah etc. The Second question, "But who do you say that I am?" was of personal nature; they had to answer from their personal experience with Jesus. The answer from Peter "You are the Christ (Messiah), the Son of the living God." was the faith declaration on behalf of all the disciples. Today, like the answers for the first question, we may have many answers about who Jesus is. But what is important is to have the answer for the very personal question Jesus Christ asks us; "Who Am I for you?". We may have extensive intellectual knowledge about Jesus. But It is not enough to answer this question. We have to find an answer from our personal encounter with Jesus. He should become a living, personal experience for each of us. Let our reading of the Holy Bible, participation in the Holy Eucharist, receiving of other Sacraments and our prayers lead us to this personal encounter with Jesus.

Back to School with Jesus: As the children are getting ready to go back to school this Fall, we are planning to have the **Holy Mass for all the students of our community**, **at 6.00pm on Monday**, **September 4, 2023**. It is a great opportunity for our children to begin the new academic year with **Jesus our Lord and Saviour**, **who is the Greatest Teacher**. Request all the parents and grandparents to encourage children to attend this Holy Mass. All the children will be given some gift. Juice and cookies will be served after the Holy Mass.
