Message from the Pastor:

"Lord Send forth Your Spirit and renew the face of the Earth" (Ps. 104). More than a century ago, a great sailing ship was stranded off the coast of South America. For some weeks, the ship lay there in the still waters with not a hint of a breeze. The captain and the crew were desperate and were dying of thirst. And then, a steamship appeared, headed directly toward them. As it drew near, the captain called out, "We need water! Give us water!" The steamship replied, "Lower your buckets where you are." The captain was furious at this arrogant response, but called out again, "Please, give us water." But the steamer gave the same reply and sailed away! The captain with anger and despair went below. But a little later, when no one was looking, one of the crew lowered a bucket into the sea and then tasted what he brought up: It was perfectly fresh water! Actually, the ship was just out of sight of the mouth of river Amazon. But they did not know that all those weeks they had been sitting right on top of all the fresh water they needed!

This happens to us also today. What we are really seeking is already inside us, waiting to be discovered, waiting to be embraced: The Holy Spirit of God, living within us from the moment of our Baptism. The Holy Spirit is saying to us at this very moment from deep in our heart, "Lower your buckets where you are. Taste and see!" We have to be aware of the presence and the promptings of the Holy Spirit in our lives to experience the Joy of living in the Spirit. We should be aware of the great works, the Holy Spirit does in our lives. 1) As an indwelling God, the Holy Spirit makes us His 'Living Temples'. 2)As a strengthening God, He strengthens us in our fight against temptations and in our mission of bearing witness to Christ in this world. 3) As a sanctifying God, He makes us holy through the Sacraments: (a) He makes us children of God and heirs of heaven through Baptism. (b) He makes us temples of God, warriors, and defenders of the Faith, through Confirmation. (c) He enables us to be reconciled to God by pardoning our sins through Reconciliation. (d) He gives us spiritual nourishment via the Holy Eucharist, by converting bread and wine into Jesus' Body and Blood. (e) He gives spiritual and physical healing to those who are sick by the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. (f) He gives the married couple the grace and strength needed in their family life, through the Sacrament of Matrimony. (g) He transforms a person and makes him the priest of the Lord Jesus Christ through the Sacrament of the Holy Orders. 4) As a teaching and guiding God, He clarifies and constantly reminds us of Christ's teachings. 5) As a listening and talking God, He listens to our prayers and enables us to pray, and He speaks to us. 6) As a giver of gifts, He enriches us with His gifts, fruits, and charisms. As we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, let us pray with Blessed John Henry Cardinal Newman's favorite little prayer, "Come Holy Spirit; Make our ears to hear; Make our eyes to see; Make our mouths to speak; Make our hearts to seek; Make our hands to reach out; And touch the world with your love. AMEN."
