From the Pastor's Desk

"I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty" (John 6: 35). When Admiral Lord Nelson a British naval commander was buried in St. Paul's Cathedral, London, England, a party of his sailors carried his body high into the cathedral. His coffin was draped with a magnificent Union Jack. Later they carried his body to the graveside. One who saw the scene wrote, "With reverence and with efficiency, they lowered the body of the world's greatest admiral into its tomb. Then as though answering to a sharp order from the quarter-deck, they all seized the Union Jack with which the coffin had been covered and tore it to fragments, and each took his souvenir of the illustrious dead." All their lives that little bit of colored cloth would speak to them of the admiral they had loved. "I've got a piece of him," they said, "and I'll never forget him." In a sense, when we leave the Church after receiving Jesus Christ in Holy Communion, each of us is taking Jesus with us and we convey the spiritual nourishment we have received from Jesus to others as we come into contact with them. In the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, Christ comes to us spiritually and physically and touches us and says, "I love you." He alone touches and satisfies our deepest needs. He alone allows us to reach out and touch one another.

In the Gospel for this Sunday Jesus makes the unique claim: "I am the Bread of Life; whoever comes to Me will never hunger, and whoever believes in Me will never thirst." Jesus was offering the crowd the Bread from Heaven, Bread that nourishes for eternal life, Bread available to people who have Faith in Jesus Christ. The passage challenges us to trust in the providence of a loving and caring God and to hunger and thirst for the Bread of eternal life-the Holy Eucharist. As human beings, we hunger for many things besides food and material possessions. We have hunger to be recognized and be honored, to love and be loved, to be listened to and to be appreciated, to help, to console, to encourage, and to receive gratitude. But only God can satisfy our various forms of spiritual hunger. St. Augustine said: "You have made us for Yourself, O God, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You" (Confessions, I, 1.). Today we are invited to receive our spiritual nourishment from the Bread of Life in the Word of God and in the Holy Eucharist. Just as our normal food nourishes and strengthens our body, enables us to work, and promotes our physical growth, our spiritual food in the Word of God and in the Holy Eucharist unites us to Jesus Christ, unites us with people around us, imparts graces that give us the strength and the power to withstand temptation, and the desire to practice virtue, and helps us to maintain, deepen, and increase the Sanctifying Grace in our soul. With faith, let us approach and receive the Bread of Life...Holy Eucharist, "the source and summit of the Christian Life."
