### From the Pastor's Desk

"Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight" (Luke.3: 4). We always see preparations being made for the public appearances of Kings, Presidents, Prime Ministers, religious leaders like the Pope, or public figures. The preparations can begin well in advance depending on who the VIP is. The concerned people will make certain that the proper protocol will be observed, and the VIP's security will be assured. Careful planning is done. Programs will be scheduled, choral presentations will be practiced, gifts will be bought, and special persons will be chosen to present them in the most gracious manner possible, so that the honored dignitary is duly recognized and appreciated. In case of celebrity entertainers, preparations will be elaborate: their entourage would arrive ahead of time to get things ready for their concert. Stages would be set; lighting would be adjusted, sound checks made; every care would be taken so that the needs and whims of each guest would be fully accommodated.

Today on the second Sunday of Advent the Gospel presents John the Baptist who came to prepare the way for the greatest VIP of all time, the Messiah, the Son of God, "proclaiming the baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins". He challenges the people of his time to prepare their lives for receiving their long-awaited Messiah. They are to prepare a highway in their hearts for their Messiah by levelling the mountains of pride and the valleys of impurity, injustice, and neglect and straightening their crooked ways. They are to get ready by repenting of their sins, changing their lives, and expressing their repentance by receiving the baptism of repentance and living out the reformations they have promised. John the Baptist, like he called people of his time to repent as a way of preparing their hearts and lives for the Lord's visit, is calling us today to get ready for something so great that it fills our emptiness with expectation. We are called to prepare the way for the Messiah in our hearts. We have to fill in the "valleys" of our souls which have resulted from our shallow prayer life and a minimalist way of living out our Faith. We have to straighten whatever crooked paths we've been walking. If we have been pushing God off to the side of our road, if we have been saying to Him that we don't really have the time for Him, now is the time for us to get our priorities straight. And we all have to level the "mountains" of our pride and self-centeredness. We are also called to repent and seek forgiveness from God and our fellow human beings. John's message calls us to confront and confess our sins. We have to turn away from them in sincere repentance in order to receive God's forgiveness. As we pass through this season of Advent let us prepare a royal road in our hearts for our Savior, a way that will take us away from the wilderness of sin and our alienation from God and back into His loving embrace.
