From the Pastor's Desk

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh." (John 6:51) On Oct. 12, 2008, during the Holy Mass celebrated at the parish church of St. Anthony of Sokolko, Poland, a consecrated host fell from the hands of one of the priests during the distribution of Communion. The priest picked up the host, and, in accordance with liturgical norms, placed it in a small container of water. The host was expected to dissolve in the water, which would later be disposed of properly. At the end of the Mass, at the request of the pastor, the parish sacristan-Sister Julia Dubowska-poured the water and the host into another container and knowing that the consecrated host would take some time to dissolve, she placed it in the safe located in the parish sacristy. A week later, when the pastor asked her about the condition of the host, the sacristan took out the container and when she opened the container, she saw, in the middle of the hostwhich was still largely intact-a curved, bright red stain, like a blood stain: a living particle of a body. The water was untainted by the color. She informed the pastor about this and he after examining the host informed the metropolitan archbishop of Bialystok. The archbishop ordered that the host be protected while they waited to see what would happen. Two weeks later the stained host was taken out of the water and placed on a small corporal, which was put back in the tabernacle. The host was kept this way for three years. A piece of the altered host was taken and analyzed independently by two experts-Drs. Maria Sobaniec-Lotowska and Stanislaw Sulkowski-in order to ensure the credibility of the results. When the samples were taken for analysis, the undissolved part of the consecrated host had become embedded in the cloth. However, the red blood clot was as clear as ever. This transformed part of the host was dry and fragile, inextricably interwoven with the rest of the fragment, which had kept the form of bread. The results of both independent studies were in perfect agreement. They concluded that the structure of the transformed fragment of the host is identical to the myocardial (heart) tissue of a living person who is nearing death. The structure of the heart muscle fibers is deeply intertwined with that of the bread, in a way impossible to achieve with human means. The studies proved that no foreign substance was added to the consecrated host; rather, part of the host took the form of heart muscle of a person near death. This kind of phenomenon is considered as mysterious by the natural sciences.

There are reports of several Eucharistic miracles happened and still happening in different parts of the world, a few of which have been approved by the Church as authentic. These miracles highlight the fact that Jesus Christ is really and truly present in the Holy Eucharist, and the Eucharist-the Bread from Heaven- is His own Flesh and Blood. We live in a world where people of all races and creeds hunger more for spiritual sustenance than for physical food. In the Gospel passage for this Sunday, Jesus proclaims Himself to be "the Bread of Life that came down from Heaven" to satisfy the spiritual hunger of people and declares that the Bread that gives for the life of the world is His Flesh. Even though it was impossible for many of His hearers to accept this statement by Jesus, He insisted that His words must be accepted literally, and that His Father would draw people to accept them. Hence, let us strongly confess our faith in the Holy Eucharist as the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ and accept Him as the Heavenly Bread, medicine for the sick soul, nourishment for a wounded spirit, light and strength for a weary mind and the Source of new and eternal Life.
