From the Pastor's Desk

Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I will say, Rejoice. (Phil. 4: 4) We are into the third Sunday of Advent which is called the **Gaudete Sunday** or the **Sunday of Joy**. While the theme of Advent is a focus on the coming of Jesus in three ways: his first, his present, and his final Advent, the readings for Gaudete Sunday deal with rejoicing in the Lord-Christian joy-as well as the mission of John the Baptist and his connection with Advent.

The theologian St. Thomas Aquinas described the difference between joy and happiness in this way. Happiness is the final end of a person, eternal contemplation of God, which is an act of the intellect. Joy, however, is itself not a virtue, but is an effect of the virtue of charity ("love"), which is full if its object is eternal and the greatest, i.e. God. Joy admits no sorrow, for it is not an act of the sensitive faculties; but supernatural joy, which is spoken of on Gaudete Sunday and in the Gospels, is an act of the intellectual appetite known as the will. To experience this Joy what we have to do is to realize the presence of Jesus in our midst, by receiving Jesus into our lives through our repentance, by our renewal of life, and by doing of God's Will faithfully. Lighting of the rose-colored candle of the Advent wreath, and the priest wearing rose-colored vestments express our communal joy in the coming of Jesus as our Savior. We rejoice because we are celebrating the day of Christ's birth; we recognize Jesus' daily presence in our midst, and we wait for Christ's return in glory.

The Gospel for this Sunday presents John the Baptist explaining the secret of Christian joy as our wholehearted commitment to God's Way by the doing of His Will. John challenges people to generosity and a sense of justice so that others may have reason to rejoice. According to John, joy comes from doing our duties faithfully, doing good for others, and sharing our blessings with others in need. John's call to repentance is a call to joy and restoration. Repentance means a change in the purpose and direction of our lives. John tells the people to act with justice, charity, and honesty, letting their lives reflect their transformation. For us, that transformation occurs when we recognize that Christ has already entered our lives at Baptism, and that His Presence is to be reflected in our living in the ways Jesus teaches. The Gospel passage reminds us that to be faithful members of the Catholic Church, it is not enough that we know the teachings of the Church, attend the Holy Mass on Sunday, read the Holy Bible etc. but what is important is to live out our Faith by caring for others and sharing our blessings with others and a total transformation in our behaviour or in the way we live our daily life.

<u>Blessing of the Chapel</u>: The renovated chapel will be blessed and opened for public worship on Sunday 22, December 2024 after the 10.00am Holy Mass by Bishop Wayne Joseph Kirkpatrick.
