## From the Pastor's Desk

'...whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve and to give his life a ransom for many." (Mark 10: 43-45) Rabindranath Tagore, who was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1913, was the first one from India and from Asia to get the prestigious award. The following lines are from one of his short poems titled 'Joy'. "I slept and dreamt that life was joy. I awoke and saw that life was service. I acted, and behold, service was joy." This poem invites us to explore the true nature of joy, service, and their interconnectedness. This poem represents Tagore's perception of the evolution of his own consciousness. Initially, he dreamt of a life filled with joy and personal fulfillment, reflecting the human tendency to seek happiness and delight in personal experiences. However, as he awakened to the reality of the world around him, he recognized that there was a higher purpose to life than mere personal gratification. He saw that true fulfillment lies in serving others, in dedicating oneself to something greater than oneself. It is through this act of selfless service, Tagore suggests, that one truly discovers joy.

Tagore's view of finding joy in selfless service is actually founded on the teachings of Jesus Christ who said, "the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many" which we find in the Gospel passage for this Sunday. This passage teaches us that true happiness comes from surrendering ourselves completely in humble service to God through Christ and all we need is a servant's heart, mind, eyes, and touch. The Gospel passage explains how Jesus accomplished the Messianic mission of saving humankind by becoming the "Suffering Servant", the Messiah freely accepting and undergoing crucifixion, as a willing sacrifice to save all the people from their sins. Jesus explains to the apostles what the nature and the criterion of greatness among His disciples should be: selfsacrificing, humble, loving service. It is by this self-sacrificing, humble, loving service, that one will find true greatness in the eyes of God. Here, Jesus challenges the apostles to share not only the power, but the service, sacrificing themselves for others as Jesus will do. According to Jesus, greatness consists not in what we have, nor in what we can get from others but in what we give to others. The CEO in Jesus' kingdom is the one who serves the needs of all the others, just as He is doing. The test of greatness in the reign of God is not how many people are in one's service but how one may serve the many. Jesus thus overturns all our values, teaching us that true greatness consists in willing, loving, humble, sacrificial service. Jesus identified authority with selfless service and loving sacrifice. For Jesus, true service means putting one's gifts at the disposal of others. Service is sacrifice, and extending a helping hand to those in need translates love into meaningful deeds. Today we are challenged to give our lives in loving service to others to become authentic disciples of Jesus Christ by putting ourselves in the humble, demanding role of servant to others, and seeking intentionally the happiness and fulfillment of those we love regardless of the cost to ourselves. The best place to begin this process of "self-giving" service is in our own homes and in our workplaces. "Life becomes harder for us when we live for others, but it also becomes richer and happier." (Albert Schweitzer)
