Message from the Pastor's Desk

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you." (Mathew. 28: 19) Christian belief that God is a "trinity" of persons is one of the basic mysteries of faith, which we can only understand in and through faith, in and through our contact with God. It teaches us that there are three distinct Persons in one God, sharing the same Divine Nature. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches the Mystery of The Holy Trinity in the following words: "There is one God, who has three Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Each Person is God, yet there is still only one God" (CCC #234, #253-256). We have Father Who is the Creator, Son, the Redeemer and Holy Spirit, the Sanctifier, and the Counselor. Even though our intellect cannot grasp this mystery, we believe in it because Jesus who is God taught it clearly, the Apostles experienced it and through the Church we share that experience. The Trinity is always described as a great mystery of Christian faith but that's not because it's impossible to explain. The Bible doesn't explain God's nature in modern scientific language. What the Bible gives is a description of the experiences, first of all of the Chosen People, the Israel and then of the disciples and the early followers of Christ, as they gradually learned more and more about who God is and what He is actually like.

Even though the word "Trinity" is not found in the Bible, the doctrine of the Trinity underlies all the major events of the salvation history...the Christmas, the Epiphany, Good Friday, Easter, the Ascension, and Pentecost. When we were baptized in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, the Triune God came down on us to stay within us. Thus, we were transformed as the children of God, the dwelling places of the Triune God and thus we have become the dwelling places of the Trinity. We should have the conviction of this presence of the Holy Trinity within us which should help us to esteem ourselves as God's holy dwelling places, to behave well in His holy presence, and to lead purer and holier lives, practicing acts of justice and charity. This Triune Presence should also encourage us to respect and honor others as "Temples of the Holy Spirit." This awareness and conviction of the presence of God within us, gives us the strength to face the manifold problems of life with Christian courage. This conviction should lead us to a life in the model of the Holy Trinity. The love, unity, and joy in the relationship among the Father, Son and Holy Spirit should be the supreme model of our relationships within our Christian families and communities. Our families become truly Christian when we live in a relationship of love with God and with others. We have to become more like the Triune God in all our relationships. May the Holy Trinity...God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit...strengthens us to live a true Christian life.
