From the Pastor's Desk

"One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to him, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?" (John 6;8-9). St. Mother Theresa shares an incident from her personal experience. Learning of a poor Hindu family in Calcutta who had been starving for many days, Mother Theresa visited them and brought a big parcel of rice to the mother. She was surprised to see how the mother divided the rice into two equal portions and went out with one bundle to give it to her Moslem neighbor. When she returned, Mother Theresa asked her why she had done such a generous deed. The woman replied: "My family can manage with half the rice in this bag. My neighbor's family has several children, and they are also starving." By this story Mother Theresa was highlighting the generosity of the poor mother. By this, she emphasizes how even those with very little, can be remarkably giving. The Gospel passage for this Sunday tells the story of a small boy who was ready to give what he had and how his sharing of five barley loaves and two dried fish became the instrument of the miracle of Multiplication of bread which fed five thousand people. Jesus' miraculous feeding of the five thousand people, using five barley loaves and two fish offered by that boy in the crowd through the apostles, teaches us that God works marvels through ordinary people. Thus, God meets the needs of people through the good will and services provided by members of His community. This gospel passage challenges us to do generous sharing. As Christians we need to commit ourselves to share and to work with God in communicating His compassion to all, as the early Christians did. God always blesses those who share their blessings, time, and talents with loving commitment. We can continue our own humble efforts at "sharing" right in our parish and community by participating in the works of charity done by the Knights of Columbus, Catholic Women's League and other charitable societies in the community. This Sunday being the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly the theme of which is "Do not cast me off in my old age" reminds us of our responsibility to share our time with the elderly who are lonely and isolated. Pope Francis in his message for this day highlights the loneliness endured by many elderly people. So faced with this reality of loneliness, we as Christian families and parish community are called to be at the forefront in promoting a culture of encounter, to create spaces for sharing, listening, to offer support and affection towards the elderly. Thus, the love of Gospel will become concrete in this world through our lives.

KOC Fundraiser for Chestico Days Fireworks: St. Peter's Parish Knights of Columbus donate \$2000, annually, to the Port Hood Chestico Days Fireworks display in support of our community summer celebration. Our council raises this money by selling tickets, **"Dash for Cash"** in and about Port Hood prior to the harness races on Friday evening, August 2nd. We run two sack races at the horse track, a men's race and a women's race, Race1 and Race 2, with six numbered contestants in each race, to determine the winning six number sequence that we connect back to the ticket purchaser who receives a \$500 cash prize. There are 720 tickets on each race for a total of 1440 tickets, \$5.00 each or 3 for \$10.00. Charities can no longer sell in front of the liquor store due to a change in their corporate policy. Traditionally, our tickets sales have been three to four hundred tickets in that location. We will be selling tickets in the Port Hood Co-op on Thursday, August 1st. Please drop by and support our "Dash for Cash' fundraiser. We need your help. You may also purchase tickets from member knights, or at the lobster supper, or at the track on Friday evening.
