Message from the Bishop for Lent 2025

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we enter this sacred Season of Lent, a time for reflection, repentance, and renewal, despite the issues in the world around us, we are filled with much gratitude for the many blessings our Diocese has received and the rich history that shapes our faith journey together. This year, we embark on our Lenten pilgrimage mindful of significant anniversaries that remind us of our spiritual heritage and call us to move deeper into the heart of Christ.

As we celebrate Jubilee Year 2025 with the theme "Pilgrims of Hope," we are invited to journey together to be synodal on the Pilgrim's Way towards justice and renewal. We are called to walk alongside others and never as lone travellers. The Holy Spirit impels us not to remain self-absorbed but to leave ourselves behind and keep walking towards God and our brothers and sisters. Our diocesan Pilgrim's Way invites us to be pilgrims visiting our parishes and shrines, participating in celebrations honouring our namesake saints, cultures, and traditions woven into the rich tapestry of our diocese. Like the faithful who have journeyed before us, may we seek the light of Christ amidst our trials, becoming beacons of hope for others in our communities.
