<u>Holy Mass for Children:</u> As part of the Religious Education Program Holy Mass will be celebrated for children and their parents today (**Palm Sunday, April 13, 2025**) at **3.00pm** in the Chapel. Welcome to all children and their families and to all who wish to attend.

Holy Week Liturgy (The Easter Triduum)

Holy Thursday (April 17) The Holy Thursday liturgy beginning at 7:00 pm includes the Presentation of the Holy Oils, washing of the feet and the Celebration of the Lord's Supper, which will be followed by Eucharistic procession and the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Come and spend some time with the Lord in Adoration. Jesus asked his disciples, "Could you not stay awake with me one hour?" (Mathew.26:40). Today Jesus asks us the same question and invites us to be with him at least one hour in adoration. The adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will be in the chapel and will be over by 11:00 pm.

9:15-10:15pm from Corner along High Road to and including Glencoe Station, Dunmore, Southwest Mabou

10:15-11:00pm from Rt. 19 intersection to Corner, to St. Peter's Church, Marble Hill, Colindale

Good Friday (April 18): The Stations of the Cross will be at 10:00 am outside the church, remembering Jesus' walking on His way to Mount Calvary carrying the Cross. By participating in the Stations of the Cross let us follow his footsteps carrying our own crosses. (In case of inclement weather, the stations of the Cross will be in the Church). Celebration of the Lord's Passion will be at 3:00pm. Good Friday is a Universal Day of Fasting and Abstinence. The Pontifical Collection for the Holy Land and for the support of the faithful who struggle to survive under political and economic oppression and persecution, will be taken during the Liturgical celebration on Good Friday.

<u>The Resurrection of the Lord (Easter)</u>: The Easter Vigil Mass celebrating the Resurrection of the Lord is at 8:00 pm on Saturday April 19th. The Mass of Easter Sunday is at 10:00 on April 20th.

From the Pastor's Desk

"Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!" (Luke19:38) With Palm Sunday or Passion Sunday we begin the Holy Week culminating in Easter Triduum. Holy week is a week of remembrance and appreciation...a week of thanksgiving...a week of repentance and reconciliation...a week to keep Christ's New Commandment of Agape love...a week to deepen our Faith and strengthen our relationship with God. Palm Sunday is a day to remember the two contrasting moments: Christ's triumph and tragedy. On Palm Sunday we commemorate the two events in Jesus' life...His triumphant entry into Jerusalem and His sufferings, crucifixion, and death on the Cross. It is on Palm Sunday that we enter Holy Week, welcoming Jesus into our lives and asking Him to allow us a share in His suffering, death, and Resurrection. This is the time of the year when we stop to remember and relive the events which brought about our redemption and salvation. The Holy Week liturgies present us with the actual events of the dying and rising of Jesus. These liturgies enable us to experience in our lives, here and now, what Jesus went through then. In other words, what we commemorate and relive during this week is not just Jesus' dying and rising, but our own lifetime of dying and rising in Him, which will result in our healing, reconciliation, and redemption. Just as Jesus did, we, too, must lay down our lives freely by actively participating in the Holy Week liturgies. In doing so, we are allowing Jesus to forgive us our sins, heal the wounds in us caused by our sins and the sins of others, and transform us more completely into the image and likeness of God. In these ways, we will be able to live more fully the Divine life we received at Baptism. Attentive participation in the Holy Week liturgies will also deepen our relationship with God, increase our Faith, and strengthen our lives as disciples of Jesus. So let us welcome Jesus into our hearts in a special way during the Holy Week. Let us be ready to surrender our lives to Jesus during this Holy Week and welcome Him into all areas of our life as our Lord and Savior, singing "Hosanna." Let us take the palm leaves we receive today to our homes and put them in a place where we can always see them. Let the palms remind us that Christ is the King of our families, that Christ is the King of our hearts, and that Christ is the only true answer to our quest for happiness and meaning in our lives. And if we do proclaim Christ as our King, let us try to make time for Him in our daily life. Let us remember that He is the One with Whom we will be spending eternity. Let us be reminded further that our careers, our education, our finances, our homes, all of the basic material needs in our lives are only temporary. So let us prioritize and place Christ the King as the primary concern in our lives. It is only when we have done this that we will find true peace and happiness in our confused and complex world and be able to experience the **Joy of the Easter** throughout our life.
