<u>Ash Wednesday:</u> We begin the Season of Lent with Ash Wednesday on March 5, 2025. Different from previous years this year Ash Wednesday service followed by Holy Mass will be celebrated twice on the day-one in the morning at 8.00am and one in the evening at 7.00pm. <u>Palms for Ash</u> <u>Wednesday</u>: You are requested to bring in your palms from last year as they will be used to make the ashes for this year's Ash Wednesday. From the Pastor's Desk

"Do to others as you would have them do to you." (Luke. 6: 31) In his autobiography, *The* Story of My Experiments with Truth, Mahatma Gandhi mentions the "Sermon on the Mount" as one of the main religious works that inspired him to search for ways of bringing about political freedom for India by non-violent resistance to oppression. He writes: "I came to see that the Sermon on the Mount was the whole of Christianity for one who wanted to live a Christian life. It is that sermon that has endeared Jesus to me." When Gandhiji was gunned down in 1948, his last gesture was to press his palms together and raise his folded hands to his lips as a sign of forgiveness to the assassin.

The Gospel for this Sunday from St. Luke, which is the parallel to the *Sermon on the Mount* in St. Mathew's Gospel, speaks of the Power of Christian Love, exercised in unconditional forgiveness. The passage gives us Jesus' revolutionary teaching about the New Way of Life that a Christian disciple should follow based on the "Golden Rule" and reminds us of our obligation to behave like the children of a loving, forgiving, merciful, and compassionate Heavenly Father. Our relationships in our communities become truly Christian when we follow the Golden Rule, *"Do to others as you would have them do to you,"*. Jesus amplifies this rule by giving the commandment of the radical Christian love which we are to exercise as God's children, *"Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you."* For Jesus, love is a fundamental attitude that seeks another's good. Jesus orders us to love our enemies and to be merciful and compassionate to everyone as God our Father is loving, merciful, and compassionate. Jesus challenges us to do for others what God does for us. *"Be compassionate, as your Father is compassionate."*

By these teachings, Jesus challenges us to rise above our human instincts and imitate the Goodness and Generosity of God. The observance of the golden rule makes us like God whose love and mercy embrace saints and sinners alike. We are invited to live a life that is Grace-filed, i.e., God's own Life working in us, so that we are able to treat others, not as we feel they deserve, but with love, kindness and mercy. God is good to the unjust as well as to the just. Hence our love for others, even those who are ungrateful and selfish towards us, must be marked by the same kindness and mercy which God has shown to us. When we pray for those who do us wrong, we break the power of hate in ourselves and in others and release the power of love. Let us pray that God may fill our life with His Grace so that we will be strengthened to practice Jesus's commandment of Love by which we will be able to create families and communities founded on the true Christian Love.
